## HOST PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

The Center for the Blue Economy's 3-5 Year Research Agenda (Scorse)

- The Center for the Blue Economy combines professional graduate education and research to promote the sustainable use of ocean and coastal resources
- Goal of 50 students (2-yr program; 25 new students each year)
- Scorse described student projects:
  - Cost/benefit of sand mining project in Marina, economic and environmental impacts
  - Non-market value of surf economics; property values near Pleasure Point
  - National database (National Ocean Economics Program; NOEP), recently updated thru 2009/2010
- <u>ACTION</u>: Scorse will poll RAP and research community for data/analysis needs; survey will be sent during summer
- Other projects under discussion or in development at the Center
  - Impacts of MPAs: in talks to conduct study
  - ONMS Site Evaluation List: no good data available to determine community benefits
  - International efforts: CITES meeting coming up, talks to determine if pelagic species should be dealt with on regional level rather than CITES level; may conduct economic study
  - Green-Shipping: regarding shipping lanes, cleaning ballast water, MIIS interested in conducting economic study

## SANCTUARY ADVISORY COUNCIL UPDATE

April 2012 SAC Meeting in Salinas (DeVogelaere)

- DeVogelaere discussed meeting highlights and developments
- Reactivation of ONMS Site Evaluation List:
  - Heavily argued at meeting
  - SAC members, Shester and Webb, drafted a letter supporting reactivation for SAC review; after discussion, letter was revised and approved
- Presentation: Forage Species, by Julie Thayer (Marine Ecologist at Farallon Institute for Advanced Ecosystem Research)
- San Francisco Exemption Area ("Donut Hole"; area off San Mateo and San Francisco Counties not part of sanctuary):

- The GFNMS Advisory Council has asked GFNMS staff to look at possibly including the San Francisco Exemption Area in the sanctuary
- o America's Cup will fund effort to address the issue (GFNMS lead)
- EBMI: MBNMS will discontinue the initiative, keeping several key projects
  - NOAA dropped Coastal Marine Spatial Planning regional planning groups; MPA Center is being dissolved (\$0 budget); MPA Center staff incorporated into ONMS
  - MBNMS will continue the IEA, collaborative fishing efforts (research and education), EFH review input, Natural Resources Assessment (literature review of habitats in federal waters)

#### ECOSYSTEM-BASED MANAGEMENT UPDATE

Risk Assessment Survey for the California Current Integrated Ecosystem Assessment (DeVogelaere)

- Survey conducted by NOAA Fisheries, Northwest Fisheries Science Center, Seattle (Leads: Jameal Samhouri and Phil Levin)
- Survey sent to RAP and broader science community
- Jameal has started analyzing survey data; ~60% responded
- Jameal is thinking about how to share survey data
- Will compare this survey to data/literature review
- Planning for literature survey to be complete in August, later will compare literature review with expert survey
- ACTION: RAP would like Jameal/Levin to return for report out and discussion

- o Pilot study report on hook-and-line fishery
  - Describes current fishery

- Whale Strikes issues:
  - West coast NMS involved in study
  - o Topics: slow down ships, change shipping lanes, NMFS determines the number of deaths does not threaten managed populations
- Damage Assessment of sunken F/V Stikine off Soquel, working on video analysis with Lindholm at IfAME lab, CSUMB
- FYI: Nachbar family trust fund available for donations

#### SANCTUARY CURRENTS SYMPOSIUM

Debrief (DeVogelaere)

- Held April 14 at CSUMB
- Theme: "From Lions to Luminescence: Linking Land and Sea"
- More than 300 people attended
- Six guest speakers on topics including tracking mountain lions, pathogen pollution in sea otters, characterizing the continental shelf, and studying bioluminescent creatures
- Dr. Ken Johnson from the Monterey Bay Aquarium Institute was honored for his scientific achievements and presented the annual Ricketts Memorial Lecture on the impacts of agricultural run-off
- Scientists, students, and environmental organizations displayed 60 research posters and exhibits describing current ocean and watershed research projects around the bay. First place (and cash awards) and honorable mentions were awarded to each of three categories of research posters (graduate, undergraduate, and high school)
